FROM OUR PASTOR

On the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount, and He brings us deeper - much deeper- into what it truly means to live as His disciples. At first, His words may sound demanding, even unsettling. But if we listen carefully, we discover that Jesus is not trying to burden us, He is trying to free us.

Jesus begins by saying something very important: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill." This is crucial. Jesus is not rejecting God's commandments. He is revealing their true meaning. The law was never meant to be a checklist of external behaviors, it was meant to form hearts that love God and neighbor. What Jesus does today is move the law from the stone tablets into the human heart.

Jesus gives us several examples. He says; "You have heard that it was said. But I say to you." This phrase appears again and again. Jesus is not contradicting Moses; He is completing what Moses began. The law said; "You shall not kill." Jesus says; anger, hatred and contempt also destroy life. The law said; "You shall not commit adultery." Jesus says; lustful desire already breaks faithfulness in the heart. The law said; "Do not take a false oath." Jesus says, let your yes be yes and your no be no. What Jesus is teaching us is this: sin begins long before an action takes place. it begins in the heart, in our thoughts, attitudes and intentions. God is

not satisfied with mere external goodness. He desires integrity - wholeness - where our inner life matches our outward actions.

Most of us may say, "I have never killed anyone." and that may be true. but Jesus asks us to look honestly at our hearts. How often do we harbor resentment? How often do we hold grudges? How often do we speak words that tear others down? Jesus says something striking; before offering your gift at the altar, be reconciled with your brother or sister. In other words, our relationship with God cannot be separated from our relationships with one another.

Jesus speaks about adultery and lust. Here again, He is not simply condemning actions; He is inviting us to the purity of Heart. purity is not repression. purity is seeing others as God sees them- not as objects to be used, but as persons to be loved. In a world saturated with images, temptations and distorted ideas of love, Jesus calls us to a higher vision of human dignity. This teaching challenges us but it also restores our sense of what love truly is; faithful, respectful, self-giving.

Finally, Jesus speaks about oaths and honesty. He tells us not to swear falsely, but to speak simply and truthfully. a Christian should be someone whose word can be trusted. Our faith is not only about what we profess on Sunday; it is about how we live on Monday. integrity means that faith shapes our speech, our decisions and our everyday behavior.

The truth is; we cannot do this on our own. Jesus does not only give commands - He gives grace. The same Lord who raises the bar also gives us the strength to reach it. through prayer, the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and reconciliation; God slowly transforms our hearts. Holiness is not achieved overnight. It is the work of a lifetime, shaped by daily choices to love, forgive and trust God.

TWO LENTEN REGULATIONS:

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18.

Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday.
2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
