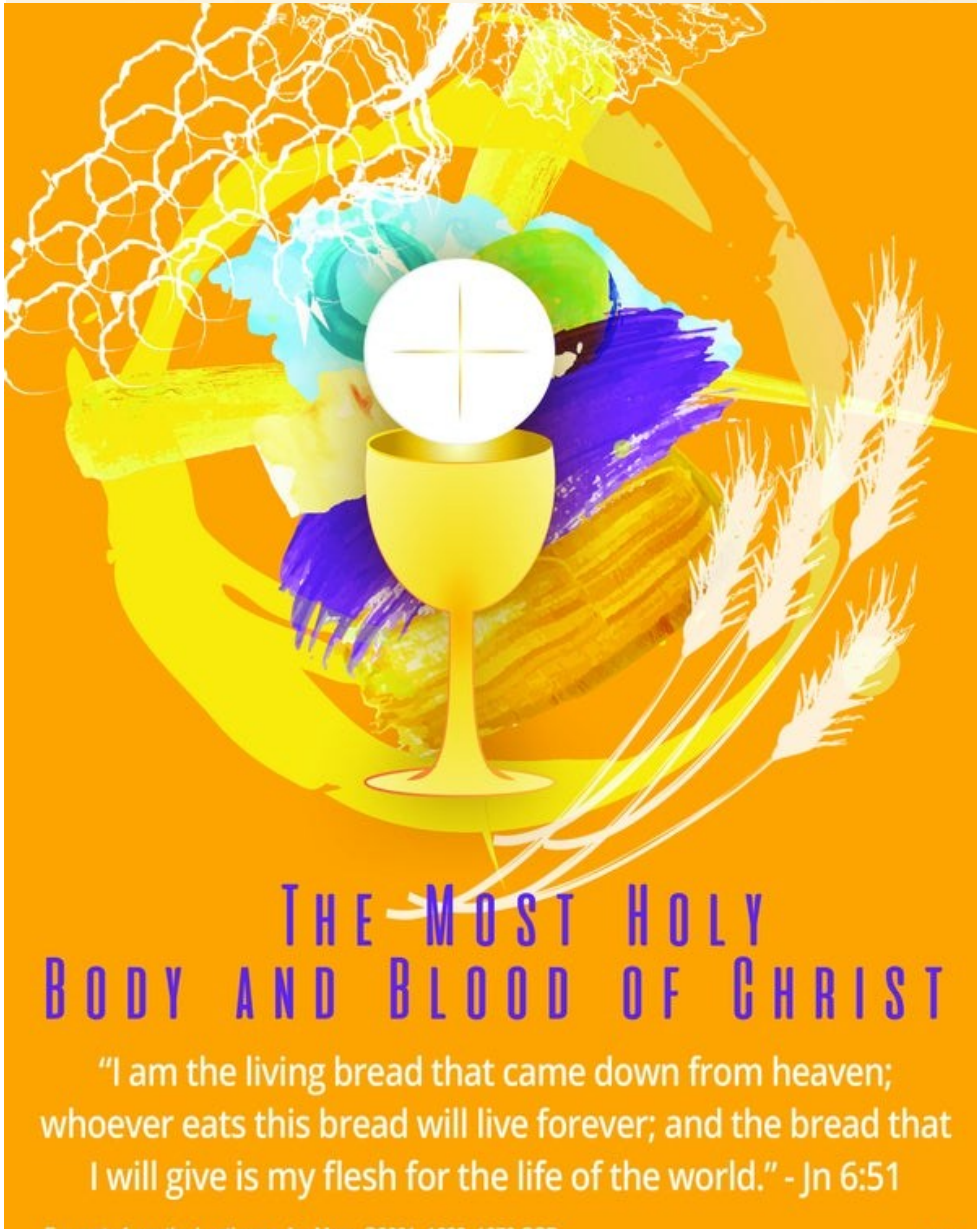

## FROM OUR PASTOR

Today the Church celebrates one of the most profound mysteries of our faith: the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi. On this day, we do not simply remember a past event. We celebrate a living reality- the abiding presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks words that were shocking to His listeners and remain challenging even today: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." Jesus does not speak symbolically or metaphorically. As the conversation progresses, He becomes even more direct; "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you."

These words caused confusion and even scandal among many of His followers. Some found them too difficult to accept. Yet Jesus did not soften His teaching. He did not call them back to explain that He meant something less. Instead, He repeated His message with greater emphasis. Because He was revealing a gift so extraordinary that it could only be understood through faith.

Every human being experiences hunger. We hunger not only for food but also for meaning, love, peace, forgiveness and eternal life. We achieve many things, accumulate possessions and pursue success, yet a deeper hunger remains. This hunger exists because we were created for God. As long as we try to satisfy our deepest longing with temporary things, we remain restless. The world offers many forms of bread - wealth, pleasure, power, recognition but none can fully satisfy the soul.

Jesus identifies Himself as the answer to this hunger: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven." He does not merely give bread; He becomes bread for us. He offers Himself as nourishment for our spiritual journey. Throughout

salvation history, God continually gave gifts to His people. He provided manna in the desert to sustain Israel during their journey. Yet the manna only preserved physical life for a time. Those who ate it eventually died.

Jesus presents Himself as something infinitely greater; "Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever." The Eucharist is God's greatest gift because it is not something God gives, it is God giving Himself. Love always seeks self-giving. A parent sacrifices for a child. A friend stands by another in difficult times. A spouse gives himself or herself for the beloved. The measure of love is self-gift. On the Cross, Jesus gave His body and poured out His blood for the salvation of the world. In the Eucharist, that sacrifice becomes present to us. The same Jesus who died and rose now offers Himself as food for our souls.

When we receive the Eucharist worthily, we enter into intimate communion with Christ, Jesus says: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." Notice the depth of this promise, Jesus does not say merely that He visits us. He says He remains in us. Through Holy Communion, Christ dwells within us. Our hearts become a tabernacle. Our lives become united with His life. We are strengthened by His grace, healed by His mercy and transformed by His love.

On this beautiful feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let us thank God for the gift of the Eucharist. When we come forward for Holy Communion today, let us come with faith. May Christ, the Living Bread from Heaven, nourish us, strengthen us, unite us, and lead us to eternal life.
